# Ways Forward in the Crisis

Planning always has a positive role to play in difficult circumstances. Many European metropolitan areas have already experienced the consequences of deindustrilalisation and decline and have planned their way to more promising futures. Many are still in the process of doing so.

The present financial crisis has hit all European countries because of the globalised nature of the financial services sector. Many European countries were in the process of trying to develop their economies through borrowing and investment and this approach has now come to a dramatic halt. Economic growth and urban development has been curtailed. At the same time public sector revenue, particularly that based on property and development taxes, has also been severely reduced. A period of austerity is in prospect across Europe.

In these circumstances all European metropolitan areas are taking the opportunity to reappraise their way forward. They are considering the fundamentals of their competitive positions and basis on which their future economies might be developed.

It is in this context that the METREX Athens Meeting will be held. Its theme is "Ways Forward in the Crisis" and it has bee structured to allow all METREX Members and Observers to attend and contribute their experience in an interactive and productive way. The following issues may help colleagues to think about the contributions that they can make.

#### Metropolitan economy

Has there been a reappraisal of the core metropolitan economic activities and how these can been sustained and developed? What is the way forward?

How have the roles of the public and private sectors changed? How will investment programmes be continued? What is the way forward?

#### Metropolitan developmen

How much have rates of development, for example of housing and commercial development, been reduced? Is there a surplus of empty stock and how is this being dealt with? What are the financial implications and how are these being handled? What is the way forward?

What has been the effect on major programmes and projects? Have they been cancelled or delayed? In particular, what will be the affect on major infrastructure programmes and projects? What are the consequences? What is the way forward?

# Metropolitan sustainability

How will the energy, water, waste and pollution issues in the metropolitan area be affected? Given the prospects for energy and food costs and security of supply, can metropolitan areas become more self-sufficient? What is the way forward?

What may be the environmental consequences for the metropolitan area? What is the way forward?

# Innovative and interactive conversational groups

METREX has drawn on the experience of colleagues to devise an innovative and interactive approach to the workshops through which such issues can be explored. They will be based on 9 small conversational groups of 5-10 colleagues accompanied by some 20 observer colleagues. This will give every METREX Member attending the Athens Meeting the opportunity to make a short, up to 5 minutes, contribution within a conversational group and to participate as an active observer in two other group sessions.

# How the conversational groups will be arranged

	The Knowledge Day format is an innovation for METREX designed to offer all Members an opportunity to give a short, up to 5 minutes, conversational presentation, without visuals, of their responses to the Crisis. The objective is to return to the core purpose of METREX, which is the exchange of knowledge and the promotion of opportunities for networking on key issues of common interest.		
	The Knowledge Day Workshops will take the form of an informal conversation between small groups of colleagues from geographic areas of Europe for perhaps 45-60 minutes. This conversation can be observed by up to 20 colleagues, who can then join in an open discussion facilitated by a colleague from the METREX Managing Committee.		
	The Knowledge Day will be concluded with a session on outcomes contributed by Workshop Rapporteurs. The outcomes will be considered and taken forward by the Managing Committee and the Secretariat through formal (Expert Group) or informal Member to Member networking. They will provide real insight into the current concerns of Members and will be published in the Meeting Proccedings and included in the METREX DIRECTORY.
