



To continuously improve the performance of our Metropolitan Regions and Areas, METREX actively links experts to learn from each other's best experiences and practices on current and emerging topics.

Metropolitan Regions and Areas invest in pilots and research across their territories that focus on workable solutions with maximum impact.

Point of departure

We are 'Metropolitan Labs'.

Metropolitan Regions and Areas are a reality resulting from a variety of processes, to not compete with direct neighbours but collaborate on common issues. Within them, people and strengths are permanently combining into unique blends of characteristics and specialities. These Regions and Areas are open in their outlook and often partner and experiment around a shared interest or inter-dependency, combining knowledge, specialisations or strengths to achieve the best, executable solutions. These 'living labs' make the ultimate partners for national governments and the European leadership to test and ultimately realise its ambitions.

Metropolitan Regions and Areas are 'Living Labs'. METREX does not simply address problems from behind a desk. We investigate and reflect on our daily habitats. We harmonise our challenges and approaches. We share our trials and errors. We experiment. We make sure our differences become productive. We enrich each other's insights. We learn and share learnings and so avoid inventing what's already been invented. We create an open mindset and share it across all European levels of governance.

That's why we:

- work iteratively evaluating and building as we move;
- continuously develop and improve by adopting shared insights from colleagues to our situation;
- monitor the fundamental effects of what we do in every intervention;
- ask our colleagues from other regions to join as experts on site.

Approach 1

METREX shares knowledge and experience on urban and rural themes.

Metropolitan Regions and Areas demonstrate the value of thinking beyond municipal and sometimes national borders and balancing urban and rural aspects in decision-making and decisive execution. These are exactly the skills and approaches that help solve the challenges, including a strong recovery from the pandemic: to determine shared interests; to combine strengths and overcome differences; to formulate solutions and come up with concrete plans to realise them. To just do it: locally, region-wide or cross-national.

Metropolitan Regions and Areas across Europe face the same challenges and in principle use the same executive strength to solve them. With our professional network, METREX creates space and time for both dialogue and action. We focus on problems in-depth to explore solutions on physical, legal, economic, social and empathic levels – from urban to rural. We use discoveries in one metropolitan region to solve comparable problems in others.

That's why we:

- connect the best spatial planners, sociologists, economists, health experts and policy-makers from all over Europe;
- promote and support intensive knowledge exchange by research, reports and pilots;
- never sit still: behind every task a new insight is hidden that can be valuable for people elsewhere in Europe.

Approach 2

METREX enables integrated thinking.

The pursuit of goals typically starts as part of a particular strategic domain. With growing complexity, we tend to stay within our own domain. Yet, complexity calls for thinking outside the box, for integrating parts of the solution from other disciplines to generate innovative approaches. Metropolitan Regions and Areas have an overarching view and bring together disciplines and decision-makers from a wider spectrum to address the pressing issues.

Metropolitan Regions and Areas are a gateway to a wide array of knowledge, experts, leaders and cultural diversity. This enables a holistic and integrated view of problems, investigating and reflecting on the real, day-to-day world of our Metropolitan Regions and Areas. METREX functions as the curator of this cross-border and cross-culture fabric, offering leaders and decision-makers access to it and representing its ideas and values.

That's why we:

- observe and investigate, record and describe methods;
- bring together administrative tiers, cross-border and cross-silos;
- don't solve problems 'instrumentally' but want to know the effects of our actions.

Approach 3

METREX accelerates urgent transitions.

Metropolitan Regions and Areas are leaders in their field, but no place is a leader in all fields. Some regions are further ahead because of past opportunities, while some have moved more quickly by focusing their resources on particular challenges. But by learning from these differences and being open to new ideas, situational leadership enables excellent followership. Through connecting and comparing Metropolitan Regions and Areas, exemplary cases and solutions can be shared. This allows us to raise the overall quality of actions and therefore accelerate urgent transitions.

ETREX members form an alliance with an exceptional insight into Europe's cultural diversity and its local needs and strengths. In this capacity, METREX wants to represent all European metropolitan knowledge and government bodies. At the same time, METREX is a high-profile think tank on metropolitan issues. We are a bridge builder between all nodes of the metropolitan mesh network. This is our network's distinct added value. This is what gives METREX the potential to apply pressure to urgent matters, such as the green recovery, to remove any time-lag between those areas setting the pace and everyone else.

That's why we:

- want to better understand the regional differences, historical facts and cultural individuality of European regions and cities;
- understand that each region and city has different valuable assets for the sustainable development of Europe;
- call on regions with exemplar solutions to take the lead in continuously changing circumstances;
- draw the attention of even the 'best regions' to surprising insights from unexpected quarters.

Approach 4

METREX contributes to a common policy framework.

As a result of Europe's cultural and political richness, decisions are taken in different ways. However, the shared policy outlook that these decisions are based upon need not be different. From the north of Europe to the south, and east to west, successful approaches are being developed and applied by Metropolitan Regions and Areas, forming a common set of principles that can inspire, direct and inform others.

METREX represents a border-crossing alliance of Metropolitan Regions and Areas. Fed by the METREX think tank of expert knowledge on metropolitan issues, the alliance offers insights on 'next practices' to Europe's national governments and to the EU. METREX translates experiences and insights from across Europe in a way that does justice to their individual merits, and makes them applicable and understandable for all.

That's why we:

- bundle insights and report back to our members and European institutions;
- that's because we understand how to facilitate policymakers and politicians from our daily practice;
- want to keep our (EU) stakeholders' principles and assumptions about metropolitan areas up to date.

Approach 5


METREX contributes to effective policies.

What we do

METREX contributes the metropolitan dimension to policies, programmes and projects on a European scale. The network is a partner of European institutions, the research community, governmental organisations and other networks.

We contribute to EU programmes and events organised by networks we collaborate with, such as Eurocities, EMA and Metropolis.


